The falcons are drawn to tall structures along Lake Michigan or major rivers, which make many of the We Energies and WPS facilities ideal nesting sites.

Housing development efforts have been a recent focus for the WI State Legislature. This includes looking at procedures for approving development to mitigate "NIMBY" opposition tactics, offer financial incentives to lower the costs of housing development, and more.
